 - an agenda or synopsis of the program;
 - an indication as to the developmental stage(s) targeted by the program;
 - a list of faculty and/or presenters;

- d) program evaluation(s) and sample paper(s) if the program is not new / has previously been offered; (2004 programs excepted); and
 - e) information on where the program is to be delivered and the delivery methods to be used
- Programs are accredited and re-accredited based on the learning criteria for the specialty area. If a program is intended to target more than one specialty you must apply to for accreditation or re-accreditation of your program(s) in each area.
 - The Certified Specialist Board has the authority to audit and review programs accredited by them and may revoke accreditation where the program fails to adhere to the general principles and the learning criteria, or the program provider has misrepresented the nature of the program.
